*'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls; when he finds one of great value he goes and sells everything he owns and buys it.**

'Again the kingdom of heaven is like a dragnet cast into the sea that brings in a haul of all kinds. When it is full, the fishermen haul it ashore; then, sitting down, they collect the good ones in a basket and throw away those that are no use. This is how it will be at the end of time: the angels will appear and separate the wicked from the just to throw them into the blazing furnace where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth.

'Have you understood all this?' They said, 'Yes.'



We choose good or evil often in our lives. To follow something good, we reject paths which are less good. Following Christ means saying 'No' to other riches. The gospel today is a call to be joyful in giving up our bad habits for Jesus.

Masses and Mass times will be constantly reviewed in light of the current pandemic. It's important we all keep safe, and follow protocols.

In order to assist us with spreading the numbers attending our Sunday Masses, the number of anniversaries offered per Mass will be restricted to 2 families.

Confirmation 2020

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated this week in our parish for the following schools:

Wednesday July 29th at 4pm for St Aidan's;

Thursday July 30th at 11am for St Tola's, and 3pm for St Senan's and St John's;

Friday July 31st at 11am and 3pm for St Conaire's.

We are looking forward to celebrating the sacrament with our families. This is the last milestone from primary school in the life of our young teenagers, as they prepare to take the next step in their lives. We ask the gift of the Holy Spirit to bless and protect them. We thank them for their preparation prior to the pandemic, and patience during Covid-19.

In order to make our ceremonies as safe and meaningful as possible, we ask every family to adhere to the parish guidelines in regard to the celebrations. While the Confirmation Masses are parish events, the numbers permitted are restricted to our families.

We thank our individual schools, principals, class teachers, and staff for their support and commitment throughout the whole school year, but especially over the past number of months. It hasn't been easy, but we have arrived to Confirmation Day and we give thanks to God.
