

GOSPEL Matthew 20: 1-16

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew. Jesus said to his disciples: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have

This could be seen as a story about wasters. Hanging around waiting for work, and not seeming too enthusiastic for work: 'they were standing idle'. Eventually they all got work and the payment was unfair. They all got the same. The story is about more than a day's wages but about how God looks on each of us.

It is a story about the good-natured God, generous beyond all expectations. The God whose love is poured unconditionally into everyone. No matter what our lives are like, God looks on us as he looked on the idle ones – they were in the end willing to work, to do something useful. God sees the goodness in each of us.

Rather than judging others who get more than we think they deserve; we can look at God's goodness to us. No matter what our lives are like, we are loved with forgiveness. The good we would like to do is pleasing to God even if we do not get around to it. God sees the heart. Where you or I might see a waster, he sees someone trying to make the best of his or her life.

Like the parent loving each child unconditionally, God loves the same way. We can be grateful for that, rather than envious of how he treats others.
