THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 25th October 2020

The commandment of God is to love him and love people: both are so interlinked that in loving people we love God.



The first reading is like a commentary on the gospel reading, to 'love your neighbour as yourself'. It recalls the people who in that time needed special care and compassion: the strange (migrant, asylum seeker), the widow, the orphan (those who are lone parents, whose parents have died), the poor who need money (the people struggling with debt, mortgage, unemployment) and are overcharged by money lenders and banks. We are to keep our promises to people and not rob them of what they need.

Jesus had a kindly eye for those in need and asks that we do also. In the world now many have suffered great financial loss as well as loss of loved ones, and indeed of good health. Pope Francis echoes this: "the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters living in the cities and peripheries of every part of the world, must not be abandoned" (May 2019 to UN). We look in this command to love those who need our care most. We can give comfort and care directly to those in our family and community and we can support those further away through donations of goods or financial support. We can recall gratefully a time when we ourselves were helped by someone and let the energy of our gratitude reach out to practical love for others.

May your love be visible and tangible, O Lord, on earth as it is in heaven.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread - and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.

GOSPEL Matthew 22: 34 - 40

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the Law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: You must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'

You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans. "If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him. "If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity.'"
