## FIRST READING Sir 24:1-2.8-12

A reading from the Book of Sirach

Wisdom speaks her own praises, in the midst of her people she glories in herself. She opens her mouth in the assembly of the Most High, she glories in herself in the presence of the Mighty One. 'Then the creator of all things instructed me, and he who created me fixed a place for my tent. He said, "Pitch your tent in Jacob, make Israel your inheritance." \* In the beginning was the Word: the Word was with God and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things came to be, not one thing had its being but through him. All that came to be had life in him and that life was the light of men, a light that shines in the dark, a light that darkness could not overpower.\*


A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

\*The Word was the true light that enlightens all men; and he was coming into the world. He was in the world that had its being through him, and the world did not know him. He came to his own domain and his own people did not accept him. But to all who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to all who believe in the name of him who was born not out of human stock or urge of the flesh, or will of man but of God himself. The Word was made flesh, he lived among us, and we saw his glory, the glory that is his as the only Son of the Father, full of grace and truth.\*

John appears as his witness. He proclaims: 'This is the one of whom I said: He who comes after me ranks before me because he existed before me.'

## FOCUS ON SUNDAY

## SECOND SUNDAY AFTER CHRISTMAS 3rd January 2021

Jesus is the One sent by God who speaks to us about the wisdom and truth of God. By accepting him we too become children of God and are filled with grace and truth.



Rather heavenly readings today – wisdom coming forth from God, her home in the heights; Jesus the Word who was with God in eternity. This is one environment of God. The other is the earth. In Jesus earth and heaven meet. He gave up the joy of heaven to come among us, die among us and rise from death. He returns to God and with him goes all that is human. Maybe it is good in the season of the child, the family and all that is so ordinary to refresh our belief that Jesus is Son; is from the blessed Trinity; and is God. He was sent to us out of the love of the Father who 'let him go' to his death and then raised him in resurrection.

All this brings the divine presence very near. In reading the word of the Word, in praying with and to Jesus, we are touching the mystery that is God. Before we know anything about God, we believe that God is mystery. We will plumb the depths of this mystery all our lives. But it comes near to us. Every mass is the live commemoration of the death and resurrection of the Lord. The bread of heaven becomes the bread of earth. Mass is more than a time of quiet, listening to a homily or enjoying some music. No matter what the externals, the mystery of Eucharist is the mystery of God made one of us in Jesus.

*When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until your come again.*
