FIRST READING Exodus 20:1-17

*(or shorter version in italics*20:1 -3. 7-8.12-17)*
A reading from the book of Exodus

* God spoke all these words. He said, 'I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You shall have no gods except me.'
 'You shall not make yourself a carved image or any likeness of anything in heaven or on earth beneath or in the waters under the earth; you shall not bow down to them or serve them. For I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God and I punish the father's fault in the sons, the grandsons, and the great-grandsons of those who hate me; but I show kindness to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.

*'You shall not utter the name of the Lord your God to misuse it, for the Lord will not leave unpunished the man who utters his name to misuse it.

'Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy.*
 For six days you shall labour and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath for the Lord your God. GOSPEL John 2:13-25

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
 Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he

There are many themes in the gospel today, and one is the theme of greed; the people buying and selling at the temple were overcharging the people who had to buy the temple currency to make their offering. This drove Jesus mad to put it very simply. We see a new side to him. Using scripture, he showed the real meaning of the temple, a place of God and where the poor are most welcome. Many of our social problems of poverty, migrancy, homelessness and the inequality in our world are the result of greed. Weapons of war are generating huge profits for big corporations. Pope Francis refers to greed in family life: 'How many families have we seen destroyed by the problem of money? Brother against brother, father against son. This is the first result that this attitude of being attached to money does: it destroys! When a person is attached to money, he destroys himself, he destroys the family.'
 Greed can destroy the earth. To quote Pope Francis again: "May the relationship between humanity and nature not be driven by greed, to manipulate and exploit, but may the divine harmony between beings and creation be conserved in the logic of respect and care."
 It would take forty-six years to rebuild the temple. It takes many lifetimes and civilisations to create God's world of justice, peace and love.
