



Jesus is having a bit of trouble as he continues his ministry. He has had public praise for his healings and indeed his teaching, even in places he was well known. He was so ordinary. They knew he 'was one of their own'. A sure way of putting someone down! They could not imagine where he got the wisdom and could do the miracles that nobody else could do. They knew his family and they too were very ordinary.

It then went further. They could not accept him. Whatever happened Jesus felt despised. It is hard to be despised in your own hometown or school or family. In today's world many people are despised and abused because they are followers of Jesus. He still wanted to help them be compassionate to them, so 'he cured few people', maybe the few who did accept him.

His mission was to heal and teach, and their non-acceptance would not stop him. He would move on to other towns and villages, often to be despised in them also. Our own acceptance and welcome of his message and love in our lives will lead to great meaning and joy.
