

World Day of Migrants and Refugees

The word of God cuts into our lives and challenges us to listen, even, if its message is tough. It is a word which promises a constant invitation in our lives to live more like Christ.

Pope Francis in his Message for Migrant Sunday 2021 writes: Among those dwelling in those existential peripheries, we find many migrants and refugees, displaced persons and victims of trafficking, to whom the Lord wants his love to be manifested and his salvation preached.

To achieve this ideal, however, we must make every effort to break down the walls that separate us and, in acknowledging our profound interconnection, build bridges that foster a culture of encounter. Today's migration movements offer an opportunity for us to overcome our fears and let ourselves be enriched by the diversity of each person's gifts. Then, if we so desire, we can transform borders into privileged places of encounter, where the miracle of an ever wider "we" can come about.

We can make our own his prayer:

Holy, beloved Father, your Son Jesus taught us that there is great rejoicing in heaven whenever someone lost is found, whenever someone excluded, rejected or discarded is gathered into our "we", which thus becomes ever wider. We ask you to grant the followers of Jesus, and all people of good will, the grace to do your will on earth. Bless each act of welcome and outreach that draws those in exile into the "we" of community and of the Church, so that our earth may truly become what you yourself created it to be: the common home of all our brothers and sisters. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

John said to Jesus, 'Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name, and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him.' But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no

one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.

'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'

NICENE CREED

We're Going to Have a Synod...A What?

What is a Synod?

For the Church it is a time-honoured way of working out together the "navigation map" for the Church at particular times. Synodality is about the whole People of God helping each other to listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church. This way of working has been given a new emphasis and a new urgency by Pope Francis who has emphasised that this is the way of being "which God expects of the Church of the third millennium". He has insisted that it is not just bishops but the whole People of God which is called to be synodal. Listening, he says, is at the heart of this way of working. He emphasises that this is not simply a matter of discussion as in a parliamentary debate. Rather it is primarily a prayerful spiritual time of communitarian discernment. It is about finding the best ways forward for the Church given the challenges it faces. A preparatory document can be viewed on www.killaloeocese.ie

Dear Parishioners, As you know 2021 marks the 6th anniversary of Pope Francis' encyclical on the environment entitled Laudato Si': On care for our Common Home. The season is an opportunity to give thanks to God for the gift of creation, to explore with parishioners the rich content of Laudato Si' and decide on what actions should be taken locally to care for our common home. The theme for the Season of Creation this year is "Restoring Our Common Home". Liturgical Resources for use during the Season of Creation, are now available to download at <https://www.catholicbishops.ie/2021/07/21/season-of-creation>

After the Season of Creation there will be a meeting of world leaders in China for a UN Biodiversity Conference (known as COP 15) and another UN meeting on Climate Change in November of world leaders in Scotland (known as COP 26). In preparation for these UN meetings there will be a petition known as the Healthy Planet, Healthy People Petition available at <http://healthyplanetandpeople.org> for dioceses, parishes, and individuals to sign. It is envisaged that this petition will be presented by Pope Francis to the Presidents at these upcoming conferences. We pray for the success of these UN Conferences.

We have been invited by Bishop Fintan to consider forming a parish group who might have a particular focus in this area and make use of these resources in our parish and schools throughout the Season of Creation each year.
