Dear Parishioners and Friends,

It's with joy we write to you for Holy Week inviting you to join us to celebrate the events leading to the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. For the first time following a two-year pause, we are delighted to be able to worship in public again. Worshipping in public and in our sacred places is central to what we are as believers – gathered around the Lord's table where we bring the story of our life, and in turn bring the story of Christ into our lives. A word of encouragement to you if you feel nervous about returning to Church, but we want to reassure you of our safety protocols, in addition to variety of ceremonies we have scheduled. We encourage you to join us with family and friends, and a special invite to our children and young people in particular.

Easter is the celebration of the Resurrection of the Jesus Christ. By means of his death of Good Friday we are given the key to the door to eternal life. Death could never and will never have the final say in our existence, because Christ has come to give us life, so we too can bring life to another. Life is always lived out in how we treat each other, showing respect, welcoming the stranger, supporting another. It's a lived gospel!

We arrive at Holy Week and Easter in a world that is not in a good place. War and evil is very much present as we as witnessed in the past while. Did we ever imagine we would be re-visiting the events of previous conflicts. War is a defeat for humanity because fundamentally it's man's inhumanity to man. We have a noble tradition of welcome into our parish since it's foundation in 1967. That welcome is now extended to our Ukrainian families and children and we thank you for embracing them into our community.

This Holy Week we take this opportunity to wish you continued blessings and good health. Do enjoy your Easter with family and friends. Do join us for our celebrations and we look forward to your company. May the Risen Lord bless us with life which comes from the Easter story so we can bring the same life of Christ to those we meet.
