


All students sitting examinations will be prayed for at all our masses and we wish all our students every success.

PENTECOST SUNDAY 5th June 2022

The Holy Spirit empowers the apostles with courage to speak the Word of God. The gift of Pentecost for us now is the peace, joy and endurance of Christ.



Today is the feast, we might say, of the apostles' confirmation. They were still a fearful group of people, all gathered with Mary in the upper room. Somehow Jesus came among them, with the gift of the Holy Spirit and also a gift from God our Father.

I think the apostles may have felt that their call to be with Jesus had finished. His death could have put an end to their hope of being his followers. The gift of the Father was being sent once again – uniting themselves with the mission of Jesus, himself sent by the Father. I think also they may have felt shame and guilt at letting their Lord down, and so the next gift was of the Spirit of forgiveness. All could now be forgiven. As we know from events in the world today, we need both gifts – the gift of courage so that we have the courage of our convictions and stand up to the oppressor and stand for the oppressed. We also need this other gift – the courage to forgive even those who have grievously wronged us.

These are gifts to us today, a sort of birthday of the Church. In baptism and confirmation, we are called and sent by God into partnership with Jesus in his mission. We are disciples on the journey of co-operation with the work of Jesus and with each other; we are disciples also who have received the forgiveness of God and called to forgive others in our lives. Maybe today we might be grateful for our confirmation day! Holy Spirit fill the hearts of all with the love and peace of the Lord Jesus.

SECOND READING Romans 8: 8 - 17
A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.



LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING Acts 2: 1 - 11
A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene;
