A reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians

Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

Make no mistake about it; if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As scripture says: The Lord knows wise men's thoughts: he knows how useless they are, or again: God is not convinced by the arguments of the wise. So there is nothing to boast about in anything human: Paul, Apollos, Cephas, the world, life and death, the present and the future, are all your servants; but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

GOSPEL *Matthew 5: 38-48*

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew
Jesus said to his disciples:

'You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.

Temperance has been described as "the seatbelt for the decision-making parts of our minds". Perhaps this is why we have a Sunday for Temperance just before Lent as we repair our "just one more" lack of control on

Shrove Tuesday!

Some of you may be familiar with the damage which has been caused by lack of control and by intemperance at other times of the year. They are saying the Serenity Prayer every day as they cope with a trail of broken promises, shattered trust, and dashed hopes. They and their families need - and they deserve - our spiritual support. The Gospel today is about forgiveness and acceptance, part of the journey to recovery is about asking for forgiveness and learning to forgive. The staff in Cuan Mhuire and in other addiction treatment centres also need our spiritual support. Their skills address the problems of addiction for each individual who is humble and honest enough to admit that they are out of control. Treatment and counselling leads individuals who are living with addiction and their families towards decisions which will be fruitful once they return home.

While Pioneers have always prayed for people who are struggling with addiction we would also like the help of others along this journey of spiritual support. Can I invite you to consider "taking the pledge for Lent" or to become a "spiritual sponsor" for a resident of Cuan Mhuire this Temperance Sunday?
