LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING Acts 10:34. 37-43.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.
Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from

the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps.117:1-2.16-17.22-23

**R. This day was made by the Lord;
we rejoice and are glad.**

1. Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end.

A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Colossians
Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! Christ, our passover has been sacrificed; let us celebrate the feast then, in the Lord. Alleluia!

GOSPEL John 20: 1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.
It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said, 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

The emotions of the women coming to the tomb were a mixture of joy and awe. Their awe was a wondering if what Jesus said was really true, that he would rise from the dead. He has said this often to them. Their sort of doubt and maybe unbelief turned to joy as they found faith in the resurrection. In the Vigil Mass we see that the message of the angel at the tomb restored their faith, and then their meeting with him as he sent them to Galilee.

The message sums up the meaning of Jesus' resurrection. Resurrection was new life for Jesus, a life we will share one day. It was also a renewed mission. The time after Easter was a time where he went around consoling and instructing his new community of disciples. As he walks with us in life, he invites us the share in his mission of spreading his gospel. The gift of his risen life is a gift for sharing, and we have our part in that.

This began at dawn, a special time of day. Morning prayer for the early visitors to the tomb helped them get commitment to follow him to Galilee and always. Morning prayer can be our time of a similar moments with Jesus and of offering ourselves for the coming day in his service. It can also be a time of gratitude for a new day and asking God's help for the day.

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES

Dear brothers and sisters, through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life.

And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church. And so I ask you:

- P. Do you renounce Satan? **C. I do.**
- P. And all his works? **C. I do.**
- P. And all his empty show? **C. I do.**
- P. Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth? **C. I do.**
- P. Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father? **C. I do.**
- P. Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting? **C. I do.**

P. And may almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins, keep us by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord, for eternal life. Amen.

The priest may sprinkle the people with the blessed water, while all sing:

**I saw water flowing from the Temple,
from its right-hand side, alleluia;
and all to whom this water came were
saved and shall say: Alleluia, alleluia.**
