**A reading from the prophet Jeremiah**

Jeremiah said: I hear so many disparaging me, "Terror from every side!"

### RESPONSORIAL PSALM *Ps. 68:8-10, 14, 17, 33-35*

**R. In your great love, answer me, O God.**

### SECOND READING *Romans 5:12-15*

**A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans**

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law - breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

### GOSPEL *Matthew 10:26-33*

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the rooftops.

Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to

God is always with us. He knows our every thought, word and deed. He loves us and constantly cares for us. He looks upon us and says, 'Do not be afraid.'

*Do not be afraid!*



The readings this weekend are about good and evil, and the constant struggle in our world between these two forces. Jeremiah was denounced for his commitment to the good news of God, and then finds

that this God saves him. Paul contracts Adam and Jesus for their roles in sin and grace in the world. The gospel gives us a picture of Jesus who is with us in all types of destruction in the world.

He identifies each of us individually, caring all about us – he knows the number of hairs on our head, and we are worth more than the sparrows and all of creation which his Father looks after.

This sort of energy fills us – the energy of knowing we are loved by God. We are asked then to bring Jesus into the world with our human energy.

Many have died in the cause of witnessing to the Lord and today we can thank God for their witness and be proud of them. The martyrs of our country kept the faith alive in Ireland, as now, the witness of so many in different parts of the world enlivens the faith of us all. We might not know that every day, 13 Christians worldwide are killed because of their faith; every day, 12 churches or Christian buildings are attacked. and every day, 12 Christians are unjustly arrested or imprisoned, and another 5 are abducted. We bring our prayers in support of them and know that Jesus will 'declare' for them now in his place with his Father.
