The presence of Christ in our world and our lives is a friendship, companionship and love that gives peace to the restless hearts and hope and meaning in times of stress and trouble.





Pope Francis regularly reminds us that we must not only evangelise the poor, but also be evangelised by them. We who are learned, (perhaps even with degrees in theology!) can sometimes believe that

those who are poor, uneducated, and living on the margins - the "children" in today's gospel, those of little importance who have no learning or achievements to point to - have nothing to say to us about God. But all our learning can never bring us closer to God because God cannot be understood, God can only be experienced. God is present to us like the air to the birds or the water to the fish. Travellers in Ireland often have a much stronger sense of God's presence and action in their lives than many of the rest of us. Jesus lived amongst the poor, he healed the sick, he befriended the rejected. Thousands of ordinary people flocked to listen to Jesus because, in him, they experienced the God who cares. The learned also came to hear him, but they went away and "plotted how to get rid of him." Those who are poor and marginalised offer us the greatest gift of all; they invite us to open our hearts to include them in our love. And if we do, we become more loving and therefore more like God. No-one can offer us a greater gift than the gift of becoming more like God. Salvation comes to us from the poor.
