

went along. In today's gospel, Jesus appears to be very rude to the Canaanite woman. It seems to show Jesus in a bad light. So why did Matthew include this story in his Gospel and not just leave it out? Perhaps because this incident was so significant in understanding the mission of Jesus. Jesus, like every Jew, had been brought up to believe that the Messiah would be sent, exclusively, to the people of Israel. The Jews despised the Canaanites, relations between them were very hostile, they would not even speak to one another. This encounter with the Canaanite woman was a "watershed moment" for Jesus, as it dawned on him that his mission, as Messiah, was not exclusively to those of the Jewish faith. He understood now that his mission was universal. Her faith deserved a response from him. So too the centurion, a pagan, whose servant Jesus healed, saying "I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith." (Luke 7 v 1-10). Before we become a Jew or a Christian or a Muslim or atheist, we are a member of God's family and God will love us and care for us. Excluding anyone from our love and care is not the way of Jesus.
