Jesus was a mystery to the Jews. They were
expecting a Messiah who would be a powerful
king, leading an army and conquering the
surrounding hostile kingdoms which kept
invading Israel and dispersing the people, and thereby ensure
that Israel could live in peace. They could not accept that
this poor, wandering Rabbi, who "had nowhere to lay his
head" could possibly be the Messiah. Nevertheless, they saw
that Jesus was clearly a good man, spoke about God with
authenticity, and his preaching was admired by all – except
perhaps some of those in authority! So who was he, then?
Was he a prophet, like Elijah or Jeremiah, come back to
admonish Israel and call them back to true obedience to God?
His preaching was certainly very similar to theirs. Peter's
recognition of Jesus for who he was, "You are the Christ, the
Son of the living God," was not just an intellectual affirmation.
Jesus said, "Not everyone who says Lord, Lord, will enter the
Kingdom of Heaven," (Matthew 7 v 21). No, Peter was not just
stating a fact. He was making a commitment, a commitment
to following Jesus. He was throwing in his lot with Jesus.
Jesus was now his leader and he would go wherever Jesus
went. When Jesus washed his feet at the Last Supper, he
understood that following Jesus meant being at the service of
others. Our belief in Jesus as the Christ involves being willing
to sacrifice ourselves for others, as He did for us.
