NICENE CREED

Focus 0

There is something about the third day. There was a wedding feast in Cana on the third day,

and on the third day of Calvary would be the resurrection. It means something big, something good will happen that day.

It is a day of hope as we are also people of hope. There will always be a third day –all else will pass. Hope in the resurrection of Jesus is that nothing except love of each other and the love of God is lasting. Our hope of his coming in glory can help us in a time of trouble.
