#### *A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.*

A man came, sent by God.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

a voice that cries in the wilderness:

Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you - unknown to you - the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

Everyone's life is a witness to something. Foster and adoptive parents give a child a whole new life, often at great financial and emotional cost to themselves.

They bear witness to humanity's compassion and care for others. The doctors and nurses of Doctors without Borders go into war zones, at great peril to themselves, in order to give new life to those who have been injured in conflict. They witness to the heroic selflessness which lie within human beings. In their lives, they, like John the Baptist, witness to the One who came that "they may have life and have it to the full." Others, perhaps very damaged by their life experiences, who care only for money regardless of the hurt they cause to others, witness to the self-centredness which also lies inside each of us.

Jesus came to show, first Israel, then the whole world, how to live as the People of God. John the Baptist pointed him out when he came, but many rejected Jesus' message of caring and sharing and universal love. Some, especially the religious leaders, also rejected the messenger; John the Baptist, like Jesus, was also put to death.

Today, we are all called to be John the Baptist, witnessing to Jesus' continuing presence in our world with his message of universal love. We may not end up with our head on a plate, but witnessing to Jesus' love for the poor and unwanted can sometimes be seriously detrimental to our popularity!
