### GOSPEL Luke 24:35 - 48

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread. They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes. Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand

### AFTER THE CONSECRATION

The disciples were shattered. They had believed that Jesus was the one sent by God to Israel. But they had seen him die. It had all been a big mistake. Their faith in Jesus had been a delusion. They had been let down badly and were preparing to go back to their former way of life, as fishermen, tax-collectors. We too may feel that way at times and wonder is our faith, too, in Jesus a big delusion? We might have no problem in believing that Jesus was a great teacher. We can easily identify with his call to "love one another." But do we really believe that Jesus rose from the dead and is now alive and present to us? It was only through a personal encounter with the risen Jesus that the disciples came to believe. So, too, it is only through a personal relationship with Jesus, a relationship which is nourished by regular prayer, that we can truly believe that Jesus is alive and present to us. Jesus is not an object of belief but the subject of experience. The Easter season challenges us to ask ourselves do we really believe. And the test of our belief is whether, like the disciples after their own personal encounter with Jesus, we go out to continue what Jesus began, namely to serve and not be served, to love "as I have loved you," and thereby grow the Kingdom of God on earth.
