FIRST READING Acts 10:25-26. 34-35 . 44-48

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said, 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise', he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

The joy that Jesus promises is the joy that we find in the type of love which is his. This is the deepest desire of the human heart: Jesus gives meaning to all our hopes for loving and being loved in our lives with others.



Focus

God of Promise

A promise is one of the most important words we hear ---- remember how often we reminded parents – you promised! Jesus makes many promises and one

today is 'as the father loved me, I have loved you'.

That can be a sort of mantra, favourite word of God, for our lives. We need it always. At times when we think maybe God seems to have abandoned us.

But our faith is that then he is most present to us.

Sometimes in prayer, sometimes in creation, often in the care and promise of each other.

In the care of each other, God is present. In your and my care for others, God is present.

The human heart wants consistent love. The love of marriage is a promise to be with someone in love forever. This is a huge promise to make, and we need God's help in keeping it. There is a promise in all sorts of other loves – friendship, religious community, ordinary family life of parents and children.

Jesus' promise – as the father loved me, I have loved you, and will love you always.

This is what the Holy spirit brings – not just truth and wisdom but the love of the Father and Son. the holy Spirit is the love of the Father for the Son Jesus. This then reaches out to the world.

Pope Francis recalls this: And what is the most important truth in life? That we are beloved children of God. We are God's beloved children: this is the most important truth, and the Spirit reminds us of this. God is a companion for life, a stable presence.
