What Is the Feast of Corpus Christi?

The Feast of Corpus Christi, known also as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is a Catholic celebration of the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist—and thus a sacred reminder that in every Mass, Jesus' one sacrifice of Calvary is sacramentally made present and offered anew for "the forgiveness of the sins" (CCC 1366).

While Holy Thursday recalls Christ's institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, Corpus Christi gives Catholics a joyful opportunity to honour our Eucharistic Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. This includes public devotion, like adoration, apart from Mass. The Church celebrates Corpus Christi to profess and adore our Eucharistic Lord. Jesus is truly present body, blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist. Not only that, it highlights the sacramental and sacrificial reality of Christ's presence. Additionally, this feast affirms the Church's teaching on transubstantiation and invites the faithful into deeper Eucharistic devotion.

We will have a short Corpus Christi procession after the 12 noon Mass in SS John and Paul Church this Sunday around the church car park to conclude with benediction and then time of adoration till 6pm. All welcome.

GOSPEL Luke 9: 11-17

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people."

For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.
