


Feast of St Mary Magdelene

On July 22nd, the Church celebrates the Feast of St. Mary Magdelene, one of the most prominent women mentioned in the New Testament. Her name comes from the town of Magdala in Galilee, where she was born.

Pope Benedict XVI spoke about Mary Magdalene in his address before the Angelus on July 23rd, 2006. He referred to her as "a disciple of the Lord who plays a lead role in the Gospels.". "The story of Mary of Magdala reminds us all of a fundamental truth," Pope Benedict said. "A disciple of Christ is one who, in the experience of human weakness, has had the humility to ask for his help, has been healed by him and has set out following closely after him, becoming a witness of the power of his merciful love that is stronger than sin and death."

On June 10th, 2016, the liturgical celebration honouring St. Mary Magdalene was raised by Pope Francis from a memorial to a feast, putting her on par with the apostles.
